We work with all of our suppliers to identify areas within the supply chain that may be at risk of modern slavery and pay particular attention to the sourcing of materials for fabrication.

All our suppliers are UK registered and adhere to UK laws and regulations we are confident in our ability to combat modern slavery and human trafficking and are committed to working with our suppliers to ensure ongoing compliance with the Modern Slavery Act.
